UT Micro Grant Project: Improving cultural competency for better access to care

In February 2019 the A2C work group was awarded a small grant (\$3,000) after proposing to initiate the *Community Review Commission on Service Excellence* (CRC or Community Review Commission) that will provide a community-led customer service review of organizations providing HIV prevention, care, and treatment in Houston, TX.

The goal of this project is to “engage communities in monitoring and evaluating stigma and discriminatory behaviors in health facilities” by recognizing organizations delivering a level of customer service excellence (see NASTAD’s Secret Shopper framework for perspective).
